For 15+ years, via LFIP, (<http://www.lfip.org>, now archived), I ran independent instructional technology operations in Indonesia and the US. We produced our own streaming video, websites, online materials and videoconferencing to avoid IP issues with commercial vendors like Blackboard, Westlaw and Lexis in the legal education consortium context. In parallel, for ten years, I ran international multidisciplinary symposia (Barnes Symposium, <http://www.barnessymposium.org>, now archived), as videoconferenced multisite conferences, for example the 2009 Barnes Symposium covering Muslim and Christian relations with two primary sites in Abu Dhabi and Columbia, SC, plus three secondary Indonesian sites participating, and one speaker videoconferenced in from Ankara, Turkey).
