- 3. <u>Patient-Centered Care Provider</u> The graduate will collect information, identify problems and provide patient-centered care through shared decision making with patients, caregivers, and health care team members. The graduate will design and implement therapeutic management plans which demonstrate respect, advocacy and responsiveness to patient preferences, needs, attitudes, beliefs and values to achieve optimal outcomes.
- 4. <u>Skills Based Practitioner</u> The graduate demonstrates the essential skills and abilities to provide consistent, comprehensive and exemplary care in varied practice settings.
- 5. <u>Communicator and Educator</u> The graduate actively engages, listens and communicates in a caring and respectful manner. The graduate demonstrates effective verbal and written communication with individuals, colleagues, and communities while ensuring culturally appropriate exchange of information. The graduate selects appropriate educational strategies to impart information and assess understanding for varied audiences.
- 6. **Population Health Promoter** The graduate applies population-based data, practices, and strategies to evaluate, design or implement population-specific evidence-based disease prevention and management programs.
- 7. <u>Collaborator</u> The graduate actively engages with and contributes to the health care team by displaying the core competency domains of interprofessional collaboration.
- 8. <u>Medication Use Process Steward</u> The graduate is a steward of systems-based resources to optimize the safety, efficacy and environmental impact of medication use systems with the goal of providing safe, accurate and timesensitive medication distribution. The graduate identifies situations that compromise safety and participates in risk reduction strategies fostering continuous quality improvement.
- 9. <u>Innovative Leader and Effective Manager</u> The graduate utilizes creative problem solving, critical thinking skills, and an entrepreneurial mindset to address challenges; promote transformational change; and influence and support the achievement of shared goals when working within teams.
